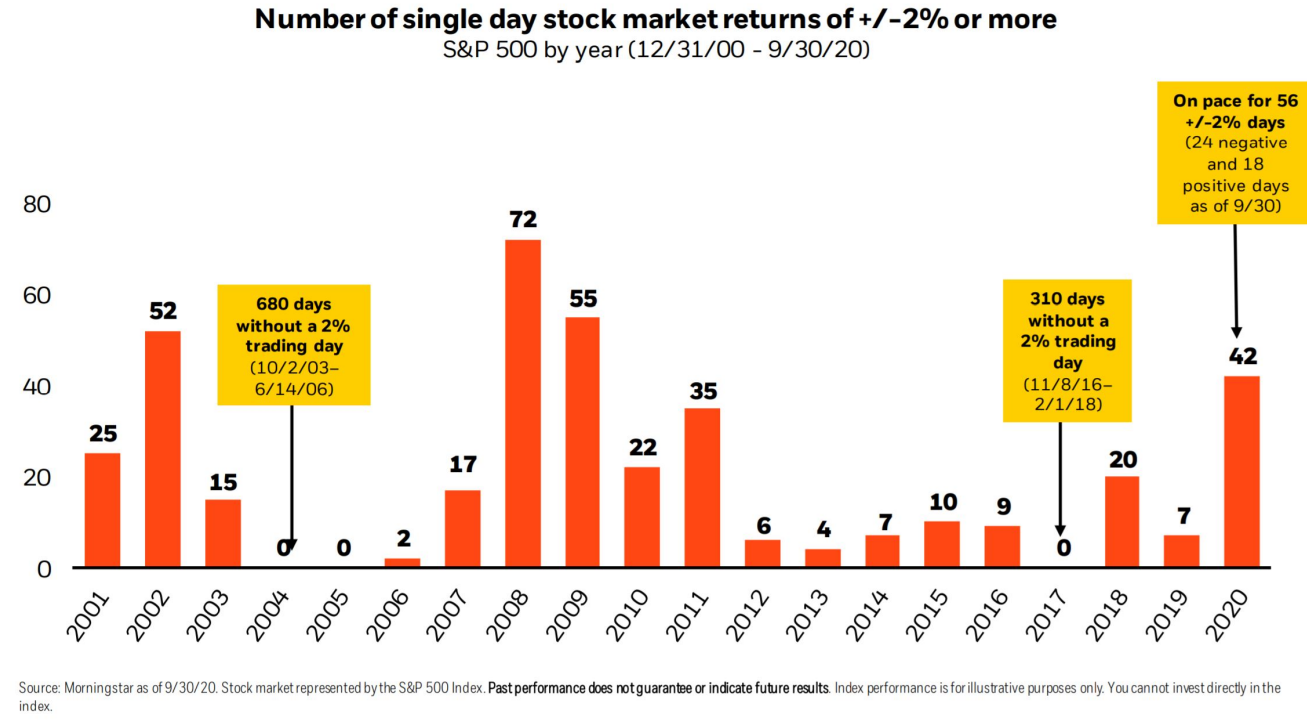




STOCK MARKET VOLATILITY

Also, you probably haven't heard yet, but we have a presidential election coming up in 20 days! 😊

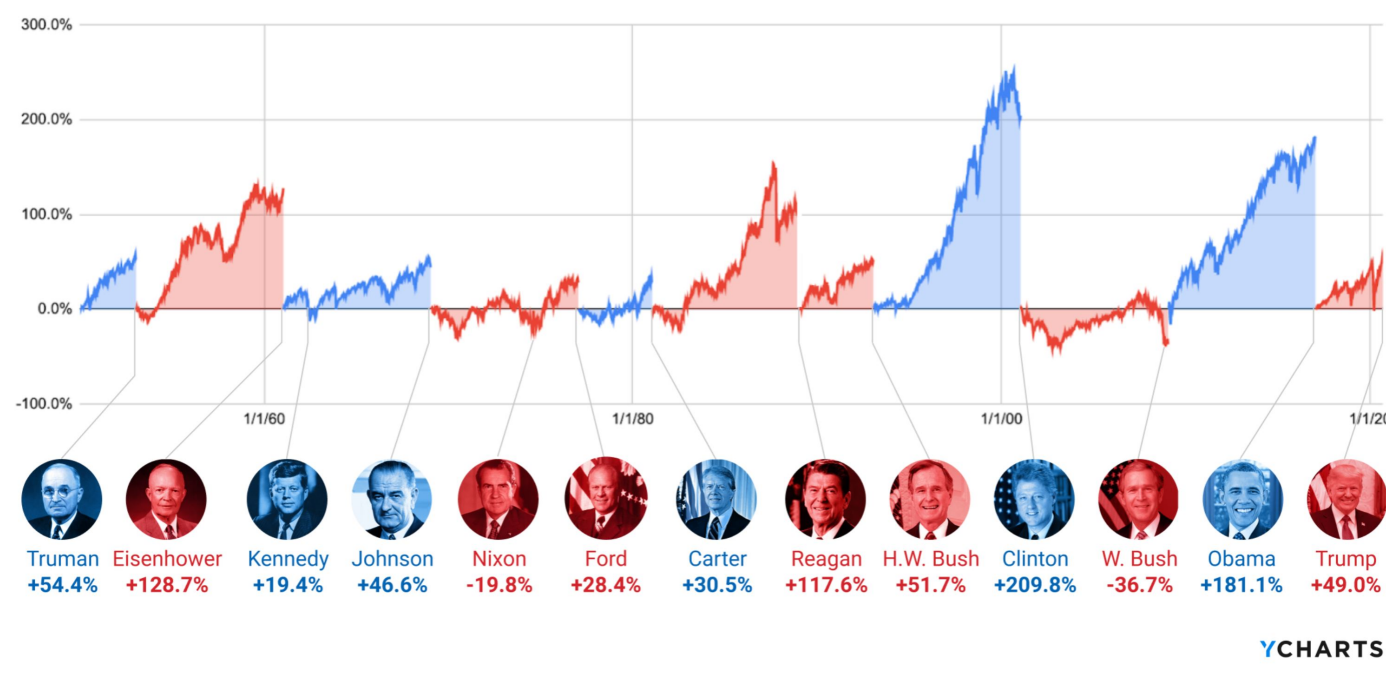
Here's my professional warning: don't make any rash financial decisions this year.

S&P 500 Performance Under Republican and Democrat Presidents



You should not make major investment decisions based on who is in the White House. As you can see above, the S&P 500 consistently grows in value over the long-term, no matter who is in office.

The first chart up top shows that 2020 is on pace to have the highest stock market volatility since 2008. However, volatility is not bad and is not your enemy. High volatility just reinforces your need to have a solid strategy in place.
